



## ENTERING FRENCH NATIONAL TERRITORY

### 1. Entry from a European Union country (including Switzerland)

**Any traveller coming from or going to a country in the European Union**, regardless of the mode of transportation (air, sea, rail or land), wishing to enter France must be able to present the following documents:

- A sworn statement that he/she does not have any symptoms of COVID-19 infection and has not been in contact with a confirmed case of Covid-19 infection in the 14 days preceding the date of travel.
- An online declaration, which can be downloaded on the website of the Ministry of the Interior :

- **A negative RT-PCR test based on a sample collected no more than 72 hours before the date of travel.**

For each traveller aged 11 years and older, the result of a negative RT-PCR biological test based on a sample collected no more than 72 hours before crossing the French border (*the time of sampling is the reference time*).

The certificate **must be written in French or English**.

### 2. Entry from a country outside the EU

Persons authorized to travel to France from a country outside the European Union (including the United Kingdom) must be in possession of:

- A sworn statement that he/she does not have any symptoms of Covid-19 infection and that they are not aware of having been in contact with a confirmed case of Covid-19 in the 14 days preceding the date of travel.
- A PCR test result (paper or digital format) based on a sample collected no more than 72 hours before crossing the French border, which shows that there is no Covid-19 infection. Since 18 January, antigenic tests are no longer accepted.

- A travel certificate for trips to France that can be downloaded on the website of the Ministry of the Interior.

- Travellers concerned must also pledge to self-isolate for 7 days once they arrive in France, and then to do a second PCR test at the end of the isolation.

## **2. Quarantine in France**

**Since January 18**, travellers coming from a country outside the EU, including the United Kingdom, will have to pledge to self-isolate for 7 days when they arrive in France and then to repeat a PCR test at the end of this isolation.

The RT-PCR tests mentioned above, as well as, if necessary, the proof of self-isolation, must be presented to the organising racing authorities.
